On behalf of the Board of Directors of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Sarnia Lambton, I am pleased to present the Treasurer's Report for the 2023- 2024 fiscal year.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Sarnia Lambton programming continued to prosper this past fiscal year.

This was made possible by the continuous generosity from corporations and individuals in our community. The fundraising committee's creative efforts to keep annual fundraisers thriving such as the "Show and Sale" and "The Big Squeeze" as well as bring new innovative events are much appreciated and vital to the success of the organization. These events bring in crucial supports from vendors, patrons, volunteers, and company sponsorships.

The organization's revenue is well diversified between donations, grants, and fundraising. Revenue increased 14% over the prior year, while the organization's expenditures decreased 10%. Overall, the organization had a surplus for the fiscal year and thus an increase in net assets. Management and the board have made sound financial decisions, as shown by the year end surplus, maintaining healthy cash and investment balances and minimal debts.

Thank you to the United Way and all donors from this past year. All donations and volunteer contributions are valued and appreciated. The children and youth could not experience the benefits of the Big Brother Big Sister's programs without this support.




